

## IMMIGRATION FILM SERIES THE MORAL LEGAL SOCIAL ISSUES

The Social Justice Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Fresno is presenting a film series that exposes the brokenness of our current immigration system and the need for comprehensive reform. Over 10 million undocumented immigrants live and work within U.S. borders, without a path to citizenship. The focus on enforcement-only policies has not reduced that number. Human rights are being violated by unjust raids, detention, deportation, and families are being torn apart. States and local governments are writing their own piecemeal legislation, such as the discriminatory SB 1070 in Arizona. An open discussion will follow each film. Admission is FREE. ### SCHEDULE

**February 3, 2012** **DYING TO LIVE: A MIGRANT'S JOURNEY** – a short film (30 minutes,) but a profound look at the human face of the immigrant, why they leave their homes and what they face on their journey.

**FRONTLINE: LOST IN DETENTION: THE HIDDEN WORLD OF IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT**– investigates Obama's enforcement strategies, journeys into the secretive world of immigrant detention, with a penetrating look at who is being detained and what is happening to them.

**February 10, 2012** **800 MILE WALL** – highlights the construction of the border walls along the U.S.-Mexico border, an unflinching look at a failed U.S. border strategy that many believe has caused the death of thousands of immigrants and violates fundamental human rights.

**February 17, 2012** **A BETTER LIFE** – tracks the relationship and conflicts between Mexican immigrant gardener Carlos and his teenage son Luis, whom he's trying to interest in bettering himself by earning an honest living, rather than drift into the East L.A. gang scene.

**March 9, 2012** **9500 LIBERTY** – a ground zero story - a Virginia county torn apart by a controversial law requiring police to stop and check the immigration status of people *suspected* of being undocumented.

**March 23, 2012** **VIVA MÉXICO** – a documentary on the Zapatistas movement in México, the repression by the government, the taking of people's land and the denial of open democracy.
